

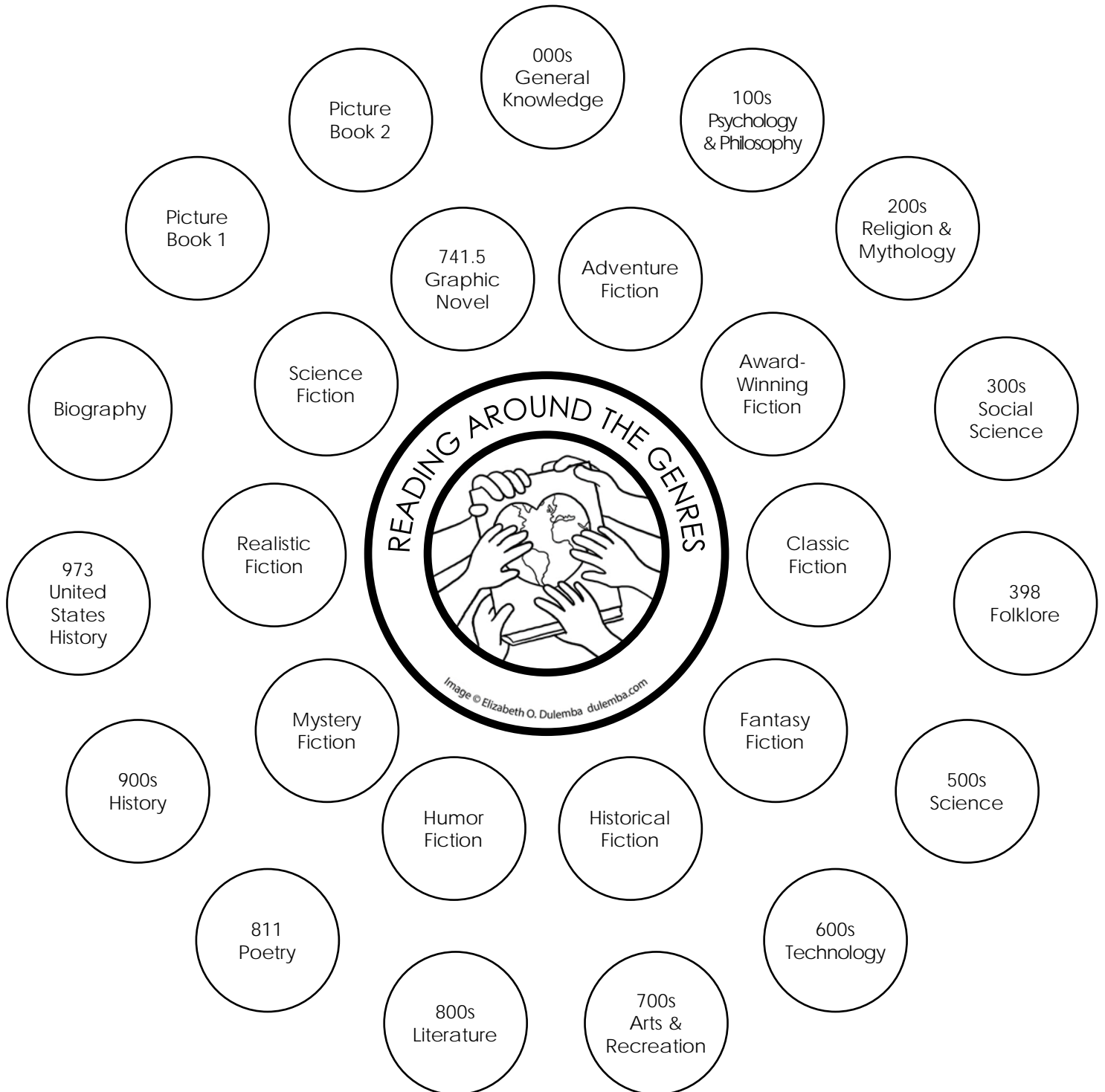

Genre Guide

There are many genres of literature. Below are some of the most common genres. Read each genre to earn a stamp.

Adventure Fiction: stories that include action

Award-Winning Fiction: stories that have won an award for best story or best illustrations.

Classic Fiction: stories that have become part of our culture

Fantasy Fiction: stories with elements that are impossible

Folklore: stories that have been passed on in spoken form

Graphic Novel: stories told through illustration panels shown as a sequence

Historical Fiction: stories that take place during a specific time period from the past

Humor Fiction: stories with funny characters and events

Mystery Fiction: stories that include a problem that is solved

Nonfiction: books that provide information about a topic

Picture Book: stories told through illustrations

Realistic Fiction: stories that take place in modern time with events that could happen

Scary Fiction: stories with unknown or supernatural elements meant to scare you

Science Fiction: stories that explore possible events often in the future or on other planets

Questions Asked by High-Performing Readers

Before Reading

- What is my purpose for reading?
- What does a preview of the text tell me?
- What do I already know?
- What do I think the text will say?

During Reading

- Does the text make sense?
- What can I do to better understand the text?
- What can I infer by connecting the text to my knowledge?
- What questions do I have about the text?

After Reading

- What did the text say?
- How can I connect the ideas to other texts and my knowledge?
- How can I use the information I have learned?
- Did I enjoy the text?
